Graduan digesa jangan salah guna ilmu dipelajari

SERI ISKANDAR: Graduan universiti mesti sentiasa memberi sumbangan terbaik sama ada dari segi etika kerja, buah fikiran dan pengurusan untuk membawa kejayaan kepada organisasi tempat mereka bertugas.

Bekas Perdana Menteri yang juga Canselor Universiti Teknologi Petronas (UTP), Tun Dr Mahathir Mohamad, berkata pendidikan universiti memberi graduan kehidupan yang selesa dan mereka patut membalas budi itu dengan menjaga nama baik institusi yang mendidik mereka.

Beliau berkata, graduan tidak patut menggunakan ilmu dan kecekapan mereka untuk mencari kelemahan pihak lain dan mengaut keuntungan peribadi serta me-

ngakibatkan orang lain menjadi mangsa.

"Jika anda dituduh menipu, orang lain akan bercakap, 'Oh! Dia dari UTP. Ini tidak sepatutnya berlaku,'" katanya dalam ucapan khas selepas menyampaikan ijazah kepada kira-kira 500 graduan dalam Konvokesyen Kesembilan UTP di sini, semalam.

Hadir sama Pro-Canselor UTP, Tan Sri Mohd Hassan Marican; Rektor UTP, Datuk Dr Zainal Abidin Kasim dan isteri Dr Mahathir, Tun Dr Siti Hasmah Mohd Ali.

Dr Mahathir berkata, salah satu punca krisis ekonomi global sekarang disebabkan golongan terpelajar yang menggunakan kecekapan mereka untuk mencari kelemahan sistem kewangan dan perbankan bagi mengaut keuntungan peribadi.

Beliau mengambil contoh Bernard Madoff yang menawarkan pelaburan skim Ponzi di Amerika Syarikat dan mengaut keuntungan berbilion dolar tetapi pada masa sama menyebabkan orang lain kehilangan semua wang milik mereka.

"Hari ini, ekonomi dunia runtuh kerana golongan terpelajar, iaitu graduan dari universiti terbaik dunia mencipta formula matematik atau sistem lain untuk mengaut keuntungan peribadi.

"Mereka cemerlang dalam aspek menyalahgunakan sistem. Contohnya, dalam sistem perbankan, mereka melihat peluang untuk mendapat dana untuk pelaburan, walaupun dana ini tidak disokong oleh apa-apa instrumen kewangan," katanya.

Kecacatan tidak halang Mohd Irwan cemerlang

SERI ISKANDAR: Tuan Mohd Irwan Tuan Daud, 22, bukan saja cacat di kaki sejak lahir, malah dia seorang kanak-kanak cekat dan tabah dalam mengharungi hidup ini selepas bapanya, Tuan Daud Tuan Yaakob meninggal dunia ketika dia berusia lima tahun.

Sejak itu, Irwan yang hanya mempunyai ketinggian 98 sentimeter (sm) dibesarkan oleh datuknya, Tuan Yaakob Tuan Man, 74, dan neneknya, Tuan Embong Tuan Kekik, 73. Namun, kekurangan itu tidak menghalangnya untuk hidup normal seperti orang lain termasuk belajar dan mencapai kecemerlangan.

Bahkan, ketika ditemu bual sebelum mengambil ijazah Sarjana Muda Kejuruteraan Elektrik dan Elektronik di Universiti Teknologi Petronas (UTP) di sini, semalam, dia meminta wartawan supaya tidak menulis seolah-olah dia cuba meraih simpati masyarakat.

"Saya hidup seperti biasa. Berjalan, makan minum, belajar semuanya normal," katanya selepas bergambar dengan Canselor UTP, Tun Dr Mahathir Mohamad di sini, semalam.

Berasal dari Pasir Putih, Kelantan, Irwan yang mendapat ijazah kelas kedua atas sudah ditemu duga oleh Petronas.

Beliau yang menerima biasiswa Petronas sepanjang pengajian di UTP berharap mendapat pekerjaan sebagai penyelidik dalam bidang elektronik.

Man shot dead after stumbling on robbers

KUALA LUMPUR: A car wash employee paid with his life for being at the wrong place at the wrong time, when he was mercilessly gunned down by robbers in Taman Sentex, Cheras here, yesterday.

Ang Ah Chai @ Naserin, 55, was entering the house of a chicken supplier to collect the latter's car for washing, when he stumbled on three fleeing robbers.

The robbers panicked upon seeing Ang and fired two shots, killing him on the spot.

Kajang police chief Assistant Commissioner Shakaruddin Che Mohd said the supplier, in his 40s, was preparing to start work for the day with four of his employees, when the three robbers walked into the house at Jalan Pelanduk 1 about 7.45am.

"The robbers herded the five men into the house and tied them up using wires. The supplier's wife and three young children were also tied up. The men then ransacked the house for valuables, taking cash and jewellery worth about RM6,000."

As the robbers were fleeing with their loot, Ang arrived on a bicycle. It was then that the robber with the pistol shot Ang twice — both shots

hitting the body — and the robbers drove off in a car.

The chicken supplier's wife managed to free herself after the robbers left and called the police. Shakaruddin said the robbery was over in 15 minutes and the victims only sustained minor injuries to their hands as a result of being tied up with wires.

Investigations revealed that Ang was an Indonesian of Chinese descent with permanent resident status here.

His body was taken to Serdang Hospital for post-mortem.

He was married to a local, but the couple have no children. "According to the supplier, Ang used to collect the car and take it for washing at his workplace near by every Sunday and that he was more like a family friend."

"We are looking for the three robbers, and a possible fourth accomplice, believed to be locals in their 30s."

The robbers were believed to have cracked again three hours later at Taman Berkeley, Klang.

A source said three men, armed with three pistols and a knife, assaulted the house owner and drove off with his car.

Shun the fast buck, Dr M tells graduates

TRUNOH: New graduates have been advised to build up a solid and upright character when they start to venture into the real world.

Instead of focusing only on how to make a fast buck, they should work hard at developing such important qualities as honour, dignity and integrity.

In short, former prime minister Tun Dr Mahathir Mohamad said he wanted to see fresh graduates striving to build an image that would be praised by anyone who came in contact with them.

"Do not use your raw found intellects and professionalisms to rob or cheat others. Don't use your acumen to find ways how to make a fast buck by destroying others."

"You should instead focus your efforts first on building an upright character," he said at the ninth convocation ceremony of Universiti Teknologi Petronas (UTP) yesterday.

Dr Mahathir, who is the chancellor of

the university, said the economic problems faced by Malaysia and many other countries since 1997 showed the destructive side of intelligence and intellectualism underscored by upright character.

He said the suffering faced by millions of people around the world was caused by "corrupted people who used their education and skills to make easy money for themselves at the expense of others."

"They learn the weaknesses in the system and then manipulate them for their own benefit without care for others. Of course, their cunning schemes cannot last long and it would be discovered. But, by then millions of people would have become their victims."

Also present were Petronas president and UTP's pro-chancellor Tan Sri Hassan Marican, rector and chief executive officer Datuk Dr Zalmi Abdul Kaderin and Tun Dr Siti Hasmah Mohd Ali.

Dr Mahathir also presided over talks to more than 500 graduates in the morning session as well as the Chancellor

Awards.

The recipients of the awards were Hanisah Abdul Halim (gold), a chemistry graduate from Kuala Lumpur; Ng Jia Wyen (silver), a civil engineering graduate from Johor; and Mohamad Assad Abd Mugni (bronze), a business information graduate from Ipoh.

During lunch, Dr Mahathir met Tun Mohd Dzanar Tuan Dzanar, who at only 96cm in the shortest person to graduate from UTP.

Iwan, from Paik Path in Kelantan, received a second class upper degree and told reporters his bright career posed a difficulty but instead made him cultivate more friends.

He was happy to have been selected to study in UTP as a Petronas scholar and had recently gone for an interview with the company for a job.

Iwan, the eldest of two children, was accompanied by his mother Cik Aema Cik Huda, 42, and grandparents Tuan Yakob Tuan Man, 74, and Tuan Embing Tuan Kadir, 77.

His father died when he was five years old.

No room to hide, politicians warned

TRUNOH: Do not commit wrong if you want to become a politician or leader, former prime minister Tun Dr Mahathir Mohamad said yesterday.

Those who wanted to get themselves into politics or become a leader needed to take cognisance of the people's welfare and feelings, he said.

Dr Mahathir reminded them that the

rakyat would sooner or later learn about their questionable deeds.

"When a wrongdoing takes place, no matter what, people will come to know about it. You can't hide your mistakes or sins."

"That is why if you want to become a leader or a politician, don't get yourself involved in bad things," he said at Uni-

versiti Teknologi Petronas here yesterday.

He was commenting on the controversy involving Transport Minister Datuk Seri Ong Tee Koon and Borneo MP Datuk Seri Tiong King Sing on the Port Klang Free Zone controversy.

"Washing dirty linen in public is very bad," said Dr Mahathir.

Walking tall with 'honours'

Irwan never lets his disability distract him from his studies

SERI ISKANDAR: Standing less than a metre, Tuan Mohd Irwan Tuan Daud nevertheless walks tall as he graduates with a second class upper (honours) in Electrical and Electronic Engineering from Universiti Teknologi Petronas (UTP).

The 22-year-old added another feather to his cap as he won the final year project award in his programme as well.

"I put all my focus in my studies and not let my disability be a distraction. I am also blessed with friends who do not have any qualms about helping me.

"My secret to success? Study hard, no shortcut to that," he told reporters after receiving his scroll from UTP chancellor Tun Dr Mahathir Mohamad at the ninth convocation ceremony here yesterday.

The young man from Pasir Putih, Kelantan, was looking for a job and had gone through several interviews.

"I hope to get a job dealing with research and development in the electric and electronic industry," he said, adding that those with disabilities should have more confidence and just go about the routines.

In his speech, Dr Mahathir advised the 1,169 graduates to work hard, earn an honest living and always uphold the good name of the university.

The graduates should never use their knowledge for selfish gains and cause grievances to others, he said.

"Whatever you earn, you must deliver in terms of services and ideas and not be accused of cheating people," he added.

Later, Dr Mahathir commented that individuals wishing to become politicians or leaders should avoid getting themselves involved in controversies.

The public would eventually find out about their scandals or their misdeeds, he said.

"We cannot hide things from the people, they will know about the things we do. If you wish to be involved in politics, do not get involved in undesirable matters," he said.

Dr Mahathir said this when asked to comment on the on-going feud between Transport Minister Datuk Seri Ong Tee Keat and Kuala Dimensi Sdn Bhd chief executive officer Datuk Seri Tiong King Sing.

The Port Klang Free Zone scandal, he said, would be a long-standing one, describing the open squabble between the two as damaging for the image of Barisan Nasional.

Ong is MCA president while Bintulu MP Tiong is Sarawak Progressive Democratic Party treasurer-general.

Tuan Mohd. Irvan Tuan Daud, 22, muncul antara pelajar cemerlang Universiti Teknologi Petronas (UTP) apabila lulus dengan keputusan Kelas Kedua Atas, Ijazah Sarjana Muda Kejuruteraan (Kejuruteraan Elektrik dan Elektronik).

Pada masa yang sama, beliau juga merupakan penerima Anugerah Projek Tahun Akhir.

Ketika ditemui, anak sulung daripada dua beradik ini berkata, beliau tidak pernah menjadikan kecacatan yang dialami sejak lahir itu sebagai alasan untuk tidak cemerlang seperti rakan-rakan normal lain.

Malah, katanya, seperti rakan-rakan lain, beliau juga berusaha bersungguh-sungguh untuk tidak menghampakan harapan mengungguli ketampanya di kampung. "Saya belajar seperti orang lain. Tiada beza," katanya pada majlis Konvokesyen Kesembilan Universiti Teknologi Petronas (UTP) di sini hari ini.

Kegembiraan Tuan Mohd. Irvan yang berasal dari Pasir Putih, Kelantan, sempena hari istimewanya itu turut diraikan oleh ibu, datuk dan neneknya.

TRONOH 16 Ogos – Setiap siswazah yang memasuki alam pekerjaan wajar menggunakan ilmu pengetahuan dengan cara yang betul demi kebaikan organisasi dan masyarakat, bukan melakukan perkara-perkara yang mementingkan diri.

Canselor Universiti Teknologi Petronas (UTP), Tun Dr. Mahathir Mohamad berkata, sikap dan komitmen yang ditunjukkan secara tidak langsung akan meningkatkan nama baik universiti malah imej negara di peringkat dunia.

"Jika semua siswazah mempunyai komitmen untuk berusaha bersungguh-sungguh dalam bidang yang diceburi, ia bukan sahaja akan memberi kesan baik kepada diri sendiri dan keluarga tetapi universiti serta negara," katanya ketika berucap pada majlis Konvokesyen Kali Kesembilan UTP di sini hari ini.

Hadir sama, isteri beliau, Tun Dr. Siti Hamidah Mohd. Ali; Pro Canselor UTP, Tan Sri Mohd. Hasan Marican; Pengerusi Lembaga Pengarah UTP; Datuk Ainon Marziah Wahid dan Rektor UTP, Datuk Dr. Zainal Abidin Kasim.

Dr. Mahathir yang juga bekas Perdana Menteri berkata, adalah penting golongan bijak pandai menggunakan ilmu yang diperolehi untuk tujuan murni.

salah kerana melakukan penipuan, katanya tindakan menyalahgunakan sistem akhirnya memberi kesan buruk kepada dunia.

Tindakannya telah menyebabkan keseluruhan sistem runtuh dan ramai yang menderita kerana hilang wang pelaburan selain banyak negara menjadi miskin.

"Pihak yang melakukan jenayah ini sangat bijak dan merupakan pelajar cemerlang di universiti, tetapi disebabkan tamak, mereka menipu dan sanggup menyalahgunakan sistem untuk memperkayakan diri sendiri.

"Anda akan bertemu dengan banyak keadaan atau sistem yang memungkinkan wang diperolehi dengan mudah. Anda perlu ingat, kejayaan sebenar adalah berdasarkan kepada idea dan usaha. Itu melambangkan karakter seseorang. Jika berjaya hadapi cabaran, mereka akan kata, inilah hasil UTP," katanya.


