Each year, we celebrate staff achievements and honour our long-serving staff. In 2017, we had two separate events, the UTP Quality Day and Employee Recognition Night. This year we are merging the two events into one in which we name today's event, Employee Recognition Day 2019. The objectives remain the same – to celebrate both staff achievements and our long-serving staff. In the university calendar, this is still one of the most important events where we formally recognise successes through the various awards, and where we also thank those who have been with UTP for 10, 15 and 20 years. I would like to share with you the recent good news on our university's standings. It was a double joy for UTP when the university rises significantly in the Times Higher Education (THE) World Rankings and Quacquarelli Symonds (QS) recently. For THE Young University Rankings 2019 (universities under 50 years of establishment), UTP is ranked highest in the nation at 101-150. The university has recorded a steady growth in terms of its rank, as last year it was placed at 151-200. We also scored the highest in two areas, international outlook and research.

For QS World University Rankings 2020, we improved our position, rising 39 spots and is now at 482nd place. We are ranked among the 1,620 institutions worldwide and have now jumped 119 places since our debut in the rankings in 2017. The analysis into the ranking results showed UTP's significant improvements in four indicators, namely academic reputation, employer reputation, citations per faculty and faculty-student ratio. For international faculty, UTP scores the highest in the nation with 82.2.

These milestones and achievements would not have been possible without the guidance and direction of PETRONAS. I would also like to take this opportunity to thank and congratulate the staff of this university – the faculty members, management as well as the support team. Thank you all for your effort and hardwork in helping this university come this far. Moving forward, we will continue to emphasise on strategies leading towards academic leadership, research stewardship, students' experience and operational excellence in our quest to become globally prominent. As we all know, the challenges of the higher education sector have over the years, become more intense, more demanding. But so far, we have managed to overcome and consider all these challenges as pathways for learning and progress. But we also need to progress, not just that, but we need to be ahead of the curve. This requires strengthening weaknesses, fortifying strengths, daringly venturing into new waters, and most of all, it requires change, and courage to pursue the impossible. In the words of Robin S. Sharma, the author of The Monk Who Sold His Ferrari: A Fable About Fulfilling Your Dreams and Reaching Your Destiny; *"Don't accept a life of mediocrity when you hold such infinite potential within the fortress of your mind. Dare to tap into your greatness."*

You are those people, and this afternoon I would like to take this opportunity to thank each and every one of you for your invaluable contribution to the University's success story.
